This morning I find myself cautiously optimistic about the next few weeks as we prepare to relaunch a more normal ministry schedule this coming September. I look forward to the journey we will share together as we celebrate who we have been and who we are being called to be!

WORSHIP SERVICES - New times! New Spaces!

Because of the lifting of many of the Covid restrictions, the church council has made the following changes. (These changes apply to both Saturday and Sunday worship services.)

Service Times

- The Sunday 10:45 AM Facebook worship is discontinued.
- Beginning Sunday July 25, ALL worship services will be in the Sanctuary.
 Saturday worship services remain at 5:30 PM
 Sunday worship services will be at 10:00 AM

Communion

- Communion will be at the rail using bread and pouring chalices only. The common cup will NOT be
 offered until further notice.
- The wafer/grape juice combo cups will be on the same table as the communion cups for anyone who feels uncomfortable taking communion using the bread and wine. Pre-filled cups with white grape juice will still be offered in the communion trays.
- Individual disposable communion cups will be used.
- All communion assistants must wear masks—NO exceptions!

Social Distancing

 The last 5 rows at the back of the sanctuary will be roped off for people who prefer being more socially distanced.

And last (but certainly not least), regular coffee hours will resume in the fall.

(Please note - ALL communion assistants are required to wear masks.)




Welcome Plentiful Plates to Holy Crossour new Ministry Partner!
