Dear Friends in Christ,

Last week I arrived back in NJ from medical leave for my knee replacement and have been in the office as much as possible while still juggling PT



appointments several days a week. While I was away I had a good deal of time to pray and ponder. Mostly about where we are in our ministry and where we are going. Of course there's the near-term with the beginning of a new program year looming large with our Fall Kick-Off on September 17th and just trying to get the usual things going after the Summer break. But I found myself thinking once again about the question of our purpose here at Holy Cross; my purpose at HC as your pastor. That may seem a little silly, I mean yes, we are here to share the Gospel of Jesus with each other and the community around us, and yes, we are here to grow in faith and support one another. But where we all need to put some energy is to define what that looks like for us and how we do that? What is unique about us as individuals, and collectively as a community, that we can clearly identify the specific things we should be doing together under the big umbrella of sharing and growing? To put it another way, what does God want us to be up to around here and how do we make it happen?

The other thing that I could clearly see in hindsight is how COVID and the shut down have changed us. It was a difficult time for everyone filled with change and even loss. We have also been operating with a smaller contingent of volunteers than ever before to make things happen. Worse yet, we have been operating for many years, even before I came to HC, with too high a dependency on the income from the Pre-School and balancing the budget from reserve/memorial funds.

I honestly believe the time is now to be intentional about naming who we are at HC and what we believe to be the most important things to move forward. It's also important for all of us to prayerfully discern where we are called to actively participate in sharing the gifts each of us have been given in time, talent, and treasure to make it all happen.

I look forward to exploring the possibilities with all of you!

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE - MAUI WILDFIRES

The significant loss of life and damage caused by the wildfires in Hawaii have turned our prayers and attention to mourning those lost, supporting the survivors and how Lutheran Disaster Response can assist with recovery. Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed over 100 lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. The Big Island of Hawaii has also been impacted by wildfires, and more islands remain vulnerable to additional fires this season.

Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires. We will work with them to provide for immediate needs and long-term recovery amid the widespread destruction.
