



Financial Update!

A sincere word of thanks to all of you who have been faithful in helping to make ministry happen here at Holy Cross. We continue to hold the line on expenses where possible while not compromising ministry. But the best news of all is that all of you, the disciples of Holy Cross, have increased your giving. Our financial status this year is trending positive, all without COVID grant related support or extraordinary gifts to date. Thank you for your willingness to listen to the leading of the Spirit in sharing your time, talent, and treasure!

PC Update!

As of this writing, we have finalized most of the details for the floor plan including ideas for how we plan to modify the area behind the building as outside space and how the new stage plan will be implemented. Some additional items of note:



Additional plans for the stage area including stage height, lighting, sound, and curtains/backdrop are being investigated.

The interior of the building has been cleaned out with the exception of the kitchen as we are still making decisions on what can and/or should be salvaged or redone.

A replacement stove, new commercial freezer and a new warming oven are being purchased. The steam table will be taken out.

The building contractor should be able to begin work on demolition of the damaged structure within a few weeks. The rear of the building will be shortened, framing steel and exterior siding salvaged where possible to be reused, and the roof and insulation will be replaced. The quote/contract for this is currently being finalized.

Plans are also underway to have the steel framing and side walls cleaned on the interior of the building where there is smoke damage/residue.

While the work is going on we are keeping track of the insurance money that we invested with the help of TD Bank and it is making us a good deal of interest. When needed, we are keeping appropriate amounts out as the T-bills come due and reinvest what we don't need until a later date.

Needless to say, it is wonderful to see progress, even if it's still too early in the process to have a propose completion date. We are grateful for the work of John Burgdorfer and Arvo Prima and company! Their expertise and willingness to serve are indeed a gift to us.
