#### Thoughts in Print—from Pastor Sue

Ephesians 4:4-6, 15-16.  $^4$ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling,  $^5$  one Lord, one faith, one baptism,  $^6$  one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all...



<sup>15</sup>But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, <sup>16</sup>from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

We read this passage a couple of weeks ago in church. Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus is one of my favorite books in the bible. The letter begins by reminding the folks there that, as gentiles, they are adopted into the covenant people of God through his grace shown to us in Jesus. That all who believe are now part of God's family for all time. In this passage, he talks about how we are all a new creation in Christ; that as a community of believers in Jesus, we are all one body and that each of us has a function within that body, for ourselves, for each other, and for the community in which we live and serve.

So... a little Pastor Sue "speaking the truth in love" as we look forward to a new program year. The "body" that is Holy Cross needs YOU!!!! And maybe, just maybe, something is missing in your life because you need the "body" that is Holy Cross. Time to get out of the bad habits we adopted because of COVID and grow as believers who worship, learn and serve TOGETHER. Without the gifts you have, the gifts you have been given by God, we are not the body of Christ both for each other and others. Quite frankly it feels as though we're missing some parts... Discipleship calls us not only to be believers, but followers. We are called to MOVE and LIVE and ACT into our faith. If we as a community of faith are to continue to serve one another, to discern and fulfill our calling, and quite honestly, to continue to exist in a challenging world, just as the folks in Ephesus that Paul was trying to encourage, it will take all of us to share who we are and what we have through prayerful discernment and participation. It is through community that we are able to share the love and grace we have been given as a gift with and for each other. Just as we need nourishment and rest to sustain our bodies, we need nourishment and rest to sustain our souls; the nourishment and rest that comes as we are together and are sustained for life in the world.

For those of you who have stuck it out through COVID and beyond; those who have sustained this ministry through challenging times and through thick and thin, you are truly examples of God's grace and love and I thank you from the bottom of my heart. For those of you who may need to reconnect, WELCOME HOME! Please seriously consider being part of our Fall Kick-Off/God's Work, Our Hands Day Event as we look toward our future in this place, as we get to know each other better or again, and as we seek what God has in store for us. **Financial Update** - First of all a big THANK YOU to all of you for your faithfulness, even as we are working our way through the summer months. I also want to thank the members of the Council and folks leading ministry areas for holding the line on overall spending. For the most part we have been holding our own. The deficit you see reported below is because the school pays the church "rent" of \$6000 a month except during July and August. What you see reflected below is the impact the school has on our overall ability to pay our bills.

We have been pretty much breaking even for the year to date until July. We're prayerful that as we get back into the normal program year in September and attendance goes up again that our giving will as well.

- Income for May = \$26,629; Actual Expenses for May = \$29,688;
   Income vs. Expenses for May = \$3,059; less than needed
- Income for June = \$25,133; Actual Expenses for Jone = \$23,534;
   Income vs. Expenses for June = \$1599; more than needed
- Income for July= \$14,849\*; Actual Expenses for July = \$24,599;
   Income vs. Expenses for July = \$9,750; less than needed\*

2024 Year to Date = negative (\$7152) including \$6000 loss from the school as they don't pay the church rent in July and August

2023 Year to Date = positive \$26,516 - this was far more than usual due to grant income related to the school



**PC UPDATE** - In case you haven't had the chance to peek in the Parish Center recently, we are making GREAT progress on getting the building back together! FINALLY! As of now, the building has been completely cleaned and cleared out and the structural work to repair the fire damaged steel and replace the roof is underway. Once that's completed we will move right in to refinishing the inside. The building will have two additional meeting rooms and a patio area when completed. As of right now we are on budget and hope to have some funds left over to address some issues with the main building but we won't know for cer-

tain for a little while yet. At the very least we know that the funding we have will be enough to complete the rebuilding work without needing any additional funds. Please feel free to speak to Pastor Sue, Janis Provost, or John Burgdorfer if you have any questions.



#### Fall Program Kick-off/God's Work, Our Hands Day


Sunday, Sept. 15th - COME JOIN THE FUN!
